Being involved helps keep us focused and accountable in our goal of eternity with God.

The world's attention this week will be on the pagan holiday of Easter, a man-made day to celebration the resurrection of Jesus. The resurrection of Jesus from the dead is the foundation of the Christian faith. If there was no resurrection, Christianity is just a hoax, and we are wasting our time in this life worshiping something that isn't real. But the truth is, the event of Jesus resurrection is undeniable. What is the significance of Jesus resurrection? The Bible tells us these facts because of the resurrection of Christ.

First, the resurrection is one of the major pieces of evidence that Jesus Christ is indeed the Son of God. Paul affirmed that Christ is "declared to be the Son of God with power . . . by the resurrection from the dead" (Romans

Second, Jesus resurrection represents an assurance that we can have forgiveness from our sins. Paul said: "And if Christ is not risen, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins!" (1 Corinthians 15:17). Jesus was raised from the grave, and our sins will be forgiven when we obey the gospel.

Third, the resurrection proclaims to the world that the kingdom of God is ruled by a supreme ruler. The founders of all man-made religions are dead, and their bodies lie in the ground. But the founder of Christianity, Jesus Christ appeared to John on the island of Patmos and said: "I am the first and the last, I am He who lives, and was dead, and behold, I am alive forevermore. Amen." (Revelation 1:17-18).

Fourth, Jesus Christ's triumph over death is not ground. This is why Paul said. "But now Christ is visco."

is Heaven's pledge to us that we too will be raised from the grave. This is why Paul said, "But now Christ is risen

from the dead, and has become the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep" (1 Corinthians 15:20).

Fifth, the Lord's resurrection provides for Christians the ultimate victory over all enemies. In the book of Revelation, Jesus is depicted as a lamb that had been slain but was standing again. This same Jesus was "the lion of the tribe of Judah" that had overcome his foes. We as Christians too will overcome as a result of His sacrifice and

The resurrection of Jesus should be a constant reminder to us of these biblical truths. The resurrection is something that we remember every first day of the week, and not just once a year. Every Lord's Day we honor our Savior's victory over death!
