In Ephesians 5, the apostle Paul mentions three "walks" that the Christian should be aware of. Each one of these is very important for us to make daily application of in our lives as we strive to follow Jesus and walk as He walked.

The first "walk" is mentioned in verse 2, "and walk in love, as Christ also has loved us and given Himself for us..." Christians are to express the same kind of love as Christ displayed toward us by His sacrifice on the cross. A burning desire that everyone be saved and work toward that end.

The second "walk" mentioned is in verse 8, "walk as children of light." Since God's word is representative of light, and Christ embodies light, God's children are to walk in the light or the teachings of the gospel of Christ (2 Cor. 4:4-6).

The third "walk" is mentioned in verse 15, "See then that you walk circumspectly, not as fools but as wise". The word "circumspectly" is translated as "carefully." The teaching here is to walk carefully and wisely in strict adherence to God's word, guarding ourselves from the world's influences (Romans 12:1-2; 2 Cor. 6:14-18).

The briefest but most praiseworthy epitaph of a man's life is recorded in Genesis 5:22, "And Enoch walked with God..." When we come to the end of our life and we cross the river of death, all we really want to hear is "He walked with God." Nothing else really matters.

In our Christian walk, are we walking in love, are we walking as children of the light, are we walking carefully? And is our walk really pleasing to God? What a beautiful thing to be said at the end of our life here on earth "They walked with God".
