Why is happiness so elusive for so many, and where can it be found? It is not where most people are looking for it! Our society focuses on externals as the source for happiness. Clothes with the right brand names, a new car, a

bigger flat screen television, or a nicer home are supposed to make us happy. Those are just superficial things. Real happiness is not found in the things we have.

Relationships are another external that are supposed to make one happy. Countless families have been destroyed due to a husband or wife feeling unhappy in their marriage. They believe that a new relationship will make them happy. They walk away usually in an unscriptural manner and their home and family are broken up in the process. Untold repercussions are experienced by the children forced to live without one of their parents. But the unhappy parent justifies their action because of their "need" to be happy. Depending on someone else to make you happy

only leads to more unhappiness.

Real happiness is found within. It's been said that happiness is a choice. It's a mindset, a determination to be happy. Happiness should not be primarily dependent upon things or relationships. A person can be fundamentally happy in the face of disappointing, trying, even tragic circumstances. They may not be happy about those circumstances, but those circumstances do not rob them of their happiness.

True happiness is inseparably connected to contentment which also begins with a mindset. The apostle Paul said, "... I have learned in whatever state I am, to be content:"(Phil. 4:11). Once again, contentment is not dependent upon externals. At the same time, being content does not mean that a person will not try to improve his lot in life. It simply means that his emotional well-being is not determined by externals. A person can be content in difficult times and under difficult situations. He knows how to be content in that he understands even though some situations in

Being content and finding true contentment produces peace within. A person who is content is typically at peace with themself. A faithful Christian has the best opportunity to be happy, Why? Because he has found the peace that results from knowing who he is and what he is about. He is a child of God. He knows that God is there with him as he walks through life every day. He is assured that no matter what this life throws at him, he has that eternal home awaiting him in Heaven. Nothing external related to this world can take that from him. He understands, because he experiences daily, "the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding" (Phil. 4:7). Contentment, peace, and true happiness are all related.
