been destroyed by fire started by the fighting around Kyiv. The picture shows Anna trying to

We are having English classes using the Bible every day. It is very enjoyable as we study John 3:16 and other passages related to God's love for us. I am always pleased to see the response when the "light-bulb comes on" and they begin not only to comprehend the English

but also the beautiful message of the Gospel. Again though, the realities of life in war-torn Ukraine are never far away.
