

Finally, there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will give to me on that Day, and not to me only but also to all who have loved His appearing (2 Tim. 4:6–8).

It wasn't long after writing these words that tradition says he was led by Roman soldiers to a place of execution where he was beheaded for the cause of Christ. Even in death Paul was faithful to the cause of Christ and the spread of the gospel.

Are we like Paul, faithful to the cause of Christ and the sharing of the gospel to an evil world in need of some good news and the salvation that is offered in Christ? I pray one day to hear those words promised to the faithful Christian, "Well done, My good and faithful servant..".


