

Throughout the Bible God used men and women just like us today with similar doubts and fears. Moses didn't think he was much of a leader, but God worked through him to bring Israel out of bondage in Egypt. David was the youngest, and therefore most insignificant of all his brothers, but God worked through him to defeat Goliath and eventually made him king. Paul used to persecute the Christians before he met the Lord and was converted, he went on to become one of the most highly regarded and prolific writers in the history of the church.
