

As Christians, we must never apologize for upholding God's truth. The world may reject or resist it, but our responsibility is to remain faithful. Just as Jesus, the apostless, and faithful Christians throughout history stood firm, we too must stand boldly, proclaiming the gospel without compromise. "Open your eyes and see!"
