"Be faithful until death, and I will give you the crown of life." Revelation 2:10

God holds our breath in His hand! As Paul said in 1 Thessalonians 5:18; "in everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you". Especially for the seemingly often forgotten gift of the air we breathe. God thought of everything!

May we use every breath to glorify His name.
