"From Where I Sit"

We are blessed with many things that we treasure in this life. But the greatest treasure to have here is the salvation from the pain of sin through the love, grace, mercy, and blood of our Lord. Can you imagine someone having the greatest treasure on this earth and then turning it loose? It is not only possible for someone to do that, but it is happening, and happening in the hearts and lives of far too many people. The question is, how can we prevent it from happening in our lives? How can we keep hold of this eternal treasure and remain in a saved condition with God? There are three key areas found in Paul's appeal to Christians in First Corinthians 15:58.

To remain saved, a Christian must be consistent in their service to the Lord. Paul charged his readers, "be steadfast..." The Christian life demands that we constantly maintain Christ-like actions, words, and attitudes. If we behave differently during the week around our worldly friends than we do on Sunday around our church friends, that's not consistent. If we randomly go to worship some Sundays but not others, that's not consistent. To remain saved, we must be ever consistent in our Christian lives. To remain saved, Christians must be convicted in their service to the Lord. Paul further charges his readers to be "immovable." Some wander away from the faith because they are not completely convicted by the love of Christ and the need for faithful obedience. Why are some trees able to withstand storms, while others are not? It is because they have been rooted and established. Read Colossians 2:1-7 and find the same solution for Christian strength and conviction.

To remain saved, Christians must continue in the service of the Lord. Paul says, "always abounding in the work of the Lord." Too often Christians just stop, sometimes from fatigue, sometimes from discouragement, or sometimes it's just plain laziness. God calls us to keep on keeping on in our service to the Lord. "Always" means that we don't ever stop. "Abounding" means that we don't put a limit on it.

God gives us this blessed assurance if we will consistently, and with conviction, continue to abound in our to service Him; "knowing that your labor is not in vain in the Lord." Folks don't be discouraged; God sees! God knows! God will reward! Let us all remain faithful!




