Vacation Bible School begins next week. We will kick it off with a "Bible Times Meal" Sunday evening following worship service. Plan on being a part and inviting someone. The theme for Vacation Bible School is "Restore and Rebuild" the story of Ezra and Nehemiah. Last week we said, Ezra had an impact on others because he was devoted to the word of God. The Old Testament gives us many men and women of faith from whom we can learn valuable lessons. One such man is Nehemiah. He was a remarkable man who can teach us very important lessons we need to apply in our lives. Nehemiah was a man "who prayed to God." The book of Nehemiah opens with Nehemiah receiving a report about Jerusalem's distress. The walls are broken down and the gates are burned with fire. Nehemiah weeps for his people and prays to God for mercy. (Nehemiah 1:4) Nehemiah was "a man who served." He chose to identify with his people who were suffering. He was involved in the work of rebuilding Jerusalem's walls. (Nehemiah 2:11-18) Nehemiah was "a man who brought the people to the Lord." After finishing the walls, Nehemiah continued to do what was right. He gathered the people and listed them according to genealogy (Nehemiah 7). Later, He had Ezra the priest read God's word to them. (Nehemiah 8) Nehemiah was not satisfied seeing the walls repaired and the people of Israel home in their own land. Nehemiah, along with Ezra, worked to bring the people back to the Lord.
