FAITHFULNESS

"Be faithful until death, and I will give you the crown of life."

Revelation 2:10

In our Wednesday night study of the book of Revelation, we recently discussed the subject of will we be known and recognized in heaven? There are two passages of scripture that come to my mind which give evidence to us to believe we will know one another there. The first is the transfiguration found in Matthew 17; Mark 9 and Luke 9. Christ was transfigured there on the mountain and there appeared with him Moses and Elijah. Moses had been dead at this point for nearly 1500 years. Elijah, we know did not die, he was taken up to heaven in 2 Kings 2:11. The body of Moses turned back to dust and Elijah had been changed. They both were clothed with different bodies from what they had here on earth. Still, they appeared to the disciples and were talking to Jesus. They both were clearly recognized. Second, the rich man and Lazarus found in Luke 16:19-31. The rich man recognized Lazarus and Abraham in the next life. The rich man still possessed memory, for he was told to remember that in this world he had many good things and Lazarus had evil things. A great gulf separated the two and although it was too late for the rich man to change, we see there was recognition in the life to come.

The scripture teaches that at the resurrection, it is our physical bodies that will be changed, not our spirit. 1 Corinthians 15 tells us that this earthly body will be changed from a mortal one to an immortal one. There is no doubt at all that mortal and the corruptible refer to our physical bodies. When we are raised from the dead, we shall have a body which God will give us. It will be a changed body. It will be an immortal and incorruptible body. This being true, we will not be known in heaven by our physical bodies as we are known here, but we will be known by our spiritual bodies, given to us by God.

Jesus, Moses and Eiljah were transfigured, but at the same time they were recognized. Our bodies will be transformed into the likeness of His body in the glorified state. John wrote, "Beloved, now are we children of God, and it is not yet made manifest what we shall be. We know that, if he shall be manifested, we shall be like him; for we shall see him even as he is" (1 John 3:2). If we shall recognize God in His form, then, does it not stand to reason that we shall recognize one another in heaven. How that will happen our finite minds cannot comprehend, must less try and explain it. But, by the same faith that we believe and accept all the miracles of the Bible, we can anticipate and accept that this great miracle will occur at the resurrection.

The thought of knowing each other in heaven is a great source of hope for us as Christians and should motivate us even more to please God and be assured that someday we will live forever in that beautiful land we call heaven. I hope to SEE you there!!



In Paul's letter to the church in Philippi, he wrote, "Yet indeed I also count all things loss for the excellence of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord, for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and count them as rubbish, that I may gain Christ."
