"Let not your heart be troubled; you believe in God, believe also on Me" (John 14:1). To me, there isn't a more encouraging verse than this one. Jesus tells us to not worry or be troubled in any way.

Jesus was preparing His disciples for His departure; His return to heaven to sit at the right hand of the Father, to rule over His eternal kingdom. When you put yourself in the apostle's place, this was a terrifying feeling to know that things were about to change. We know and understand from the scriptures that when a loved one who is faithful to God dies, we will see them again if we ourselves live a faithful life. There is comfort in knowing that and Jesus is promising that in John 14; "That where I am, there you may be also...".

And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself, that where I am, there you may be also. And where I go you know, and the way you know" (John 14:2-4).

Those men who were terrified that Jesus was leaving them alone in this world needed to know that He would be coming back to get them; He wasn't leaving them all alone. And when you feel as though He has left you all alone, you need to know that He is now, preparing a place for you and He is coming back to get you and all those who belong to Him. Jesus didn't leave us in the dark. He told us where He was going and how we could follow Him. He left us an example to follow (1 Peter 2:21-24). He intended for us to follow His example so that we can be with Him in heaven when that time comes. He may not be here now in person, but He is here spiritually speaking. He has not gone and left us alone. He has told us how to get where He is and that if we will do those faithful things, He will come again and take us home to be with Him.

We find ourselves right now in an unprecedented time of uncertainty. The whole world seems to have lost it's mind. Through all of this discouragement, here is the encouragement that I find: Jesus is coming back to get all of us who are faithfully serving Him, even through times as difficult as this. He is still God and He still reigns in heaven. "Let not your heart be troubled'.

We had another Sunday with good attendance. An uplifting day and the weather this week looks "beautiful." This Wednesday night is the beginning of our March Series with Jim Brown. The work in the auditorium continues this week and will be completed Sunday. Due to the ongoing work, this week we will meet in the fellowship hall for Wednesday night service instead of the auditorium. Invite someone to come! When we hear the word stewardship, the thought of money usually comes to mind. The definition of *stewardship* is the responsible overseeing and protection of something considered worth caring for and preserving. Stewardship is just not about money; it is about everything. Stewardship is a way of life. Although God gives us "all things richly to enjoy" nothing is ours. Nothing really belongs to us. God owns everything; we are responsible for how we treat it and what we do with it. A steward is one who manages the possessions of another. We are all stewards of the resources, abilities, and opportunities that God has entrusted to our care, and one day each one of us will give an account for how we have managed what the God has given us. Our life is bookended with conception (beginning - Jeremiah 1:5) and death (Hebrews 9:27). In between these two points is time. We are stewards of our time. We our responsible for overseeing, protecting, caring, and preserving. "See then that ye walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil." (Ephesians 5:15-16) Godliness is the result of a disciplined spiritual life. But at the heart of a disciplined spiritual life is the disciplined use of time. Why use your time wisely? Because the days are evil. Sin abounds. Christians should seize upon every opportunity to do good and make the most of time. There are things in this world that can draw us away from the practice of godliness. Things that would rob our *time* for effective use. Paul wrote in Philippians "Finally, brethren, whatever things are true, whatever things are 4:8, noble, whatever things are just, whatever things are pure, whatever things are lovely, whatever things are of good report, if there is any virtue and if there is anything praiseworthy--meditate on these things." Looking forward to seeing you Sunday. Keep the faith, *be steadfast, immovable,* and *abounding!* God will see us through.
