These will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life".

Christ gave us the ultimate example of service, saying, "For even the Son of man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many" (Mark 10:45). Jesus was, always humble, always thinking of others, always serving others. I need to learn from Him!

So, let's pray for opportunities to serve one another daily and be ready to do so. May we grow in good works and serve one another with love.


