"From Where I Sit"

It was great to see each of you here Sunday. We had a wonderful number gathered to worship together and give honor and praise to God. If you're reading this please consider this your personal invitation from me to join us for any or

all of our services here at Centerville. I promise you will find a warm and friendly welcome.

In Psalm 32:8 we read, "I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will counsel you and watch over you". In preparation for living, we should enroll in the School of God. He promises to be our teacher. I still remember my first-grade teacher Mrs. King and what an impact that she had on my life even today as I am in my mid 50's. Her instruction and her

kindness, as well as all my teachers, were fundamental to my educational growth. But God promises to be our spiritual teacher and will help us in our spiritual growth. Both are needed, but one is more important in the end than the other.

In looking again at this verse, you see that God promises three things. First, He says, "I will instruct you." This means to communicate knowledge, to inform. God sees our day by day, step by step needs and provides the guidance and the counseling we need, for He keeps His eyes on us at all times. "Indeed, he who watches over Israel will neither slumber or sleep" (Ps. 121:4). God, the all-seeing eye is watching us and wanting us to turn to Him and seek His guidance. I just love the promise of 2 Chronicles 7:14; "If My people who are called by My name will humble themselves, and pray and seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land".



The year of 2022 is passing quickly. We are approaching the end of May. Memorial Day will be this Monday. Memorial Day has become increasingly a fun day of swimming, fishing, boating, picnicking, backyard barbecue, and the like. These things in themselves are not wrong and are enjoyable times to spend with family. Traditional observance of Memorial Day has diminished over the years. Many have forgotten the meaning and traditions of Memorial Day. Memorial Day was originally defined by date as May 30th. Memorial Day was officially proclaimed on May 5th,1868 by General John Logan, national commander of the Grand Army of the Republic and was first observed on May 30th,1868, when flowers were placed on the graves of the Union and Confederate soldiers at Arlington National Cemetery. After World War 1 the folially changed from honoring just those who died fighting in the Civil War to honoring Americans who died fighting in any war. Congress with the Act of 1971 changed it from May 30th to last Monday in May. Memorials are important. We read about memorials in the Old Testament. In the New Testament Christianity also has its memorial. Jesus Christ established this memorial. It was to be a weekly reminder of His life and death. It was to be a simple feast called a supper. The Lord's Supper. It was to be observed on a specific day and that was the Lord's Day. It was to involve two, very common elements. There would be flat tasteless unleavened bread to remind us of His body and there would be grape juice, fruit of the vine, to remind us of His blood. "When He had given thanks, He broke it and said, "Take, eat; this is My body which is broken for you; do this in remembrance of Me." In the same manner He also took the cup after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me." (I Corinthians 11:24-25) This memorial has been observed over 2000 years. As often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death, till He comes. Looking forward to seeing you Sunday. Keep the faith, be steadfast, immovable, and abounding! God will see us through.
