David faced times like these in his life. The Psalms are filled with verses that express his despair and feeling of abandonment. Yet the Psalms also provide us with the key to living, making it through those dark times in life. Psalm 119:89-95; "Forever, O LORD, Your word is settled in heaven. Your faithfulness continues throughout all generations; You established the earth, and it stands. They stand this day according to Your ordinances..."



HAVE YOU EVER HEARD OF the boll weevil beetle? In the early 1900s, this ugly little bug almost single-handedly financially crushed the city of Enterprise, Alabama. The boll weevil feeds on cotton buds. Cotton was the primary cash crop for Southern Alabama at this time, and Enterprise was struggling. In two years, their cotton production had dropped 90 percent! A small group of farmers in Enterprise decided they needed to try something different. Instead of focusing on the boll weevil, they switched to a new crop. Peanuts. In just a few years, Enterprise became the largest producer of peanuts in the country, leading to tremendous economic prosperity. The cotton farmers found great reasons to celebrate what was an economic tragedy and a desperate situation. In fact, today, there is even a monument in Enterprise dedicated to the pesky pest!

Romans 5:3-5 says, "...but we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us.." It is hard to even think about celebrating when we are in the middle of suffering. But these verses remind us that God uses our suffering to transform us into the likeness of Christ. God wants us to grow in endurance, character, and hope. He wants us to know His love in a brand-new way.

Imagine the cotton farmers' frustration when dealing with the boll weevils. Yet, after a few years, they rejoiced in their suffering because of what it had produced! Remember that God is at work when you are walking through a difficult season. He might be opening another door (like growing

peanuts!). Or even if your challenging season continues, you can trust that God is at work in and through you. God finishes what He starts. Have a great week! In Him, Carter



Sunday was a beautiful day! The fall season has begun, and the weather could not be more pleasant. This Sunday will be the deadline for submitting names considered for deacons. Please place your submission cards in the box by Sunday PM. This year seems to have gone by quickly. We are in the last quarter of the year, 2023 is only three months away. Our theme for 2022 came from I Corinthians 15:58, "be steadfast, immovable, and always abounding in the work of the Lord." We have heard it read numerous times throughout the year. The apostle Paul compares the Christian life with a long-distance race. There are many who are not running the race at all. Some are merely jogging, some are just walking, and many more sit watching as spectators. The Hebrew writer wrote in Hebrews 12:1, "let us run with endurance the race that is set before us." Our example and encouragement are "the great cloud of witnesses" mentioned in the previous chapter. These faithful men and women of God. We are to run the race of faith like they did, always trusting, never giving up, no matter what obstacles, hardships, or sacrifice they faced. It was October 20, 1968, the Mexico City Olympic Stadium was both the starting line and the finish line of the Olympic marathon. During the race, John Stephen Akhwari of Tanzania stumbled and seriously injured his leg. Medics bandaged his bloody calf, and then Akhwari rose and began to hobble forward. Though in agonizing pain, he continued mile after mile. He finally entered the stadium, he completed the final lap, hobbling all the way. Later, a sportswriter asked, why didn't you just quit? Akhwari responded, "My country did not send me 5,000 miles to start the race. It sent me to finish the race." Jesus knew the finish line of His race on earth. What was at the end of the race motivated Jesus to leave heaven and endure on earth. Jesus ran for two future things: (1) the joy set before Him; and (2) the glory of sitting at the right hand of God's throne. (Hebrews 12:2) When we get weary in our race and our fa
